The formal opening of the new Education Centre, Teenagers' Wing, Snowflake Cold Room and daycare/respite areas will be in June 2026 and we can't wait!



Mental Health Service Week 4th – 12th October 2025



Mental Health Service Week is part of the larger Lions International <u>Global Week of Service</u>. During this week, Lions Clubs globally, including those in the MD105 and in our District, are focusing on promoting mental wellness, raising awareness, breaking the stigma, and providing support for those facing mental and emotional challenges. The week aims to unite communities to foster compassion and support mental health initiatives.

There are many ways in which you and your Club can get involved. Here are just a few ways to get you started:

- **Promote well-being:** Engage in conversations about mental health on your Facebook page or other social media. There are suggested social media graphics/posts which can be downloaded from the MD Mental Health Resources Bookshelf.
- Hold a Walk and Talk or Tea and Talk event: A leisurely walk in a local park or a
 coffee/tea morning at a community hall provides a relaxed setting for people to connect.
 The focus is on conversation and social connection, which is a powerful way to combat
 loneliness and isolation.
- **Host a Community Hub:** Partner with a local community centre, library, or cafe to create a designated "Lions' Mental Wellness Corner" for the week. This space could offer a welcoming spot for people to sit, have a chat, and find information.
- Community Clean-Up or Gardening Day: Organise a community gardening or litterpicking event. Volunteering and spending time outdoors are proven to boost mental
 wellness. It also gives people a sense of purpose and the satisfaction of improving their
 local environment.

Tales from our Clubs

Otley Lions



Otley Lions have been reflecting on a number of excellent summer service projects. The first of these was their recent, slightly 'quackers', Hook-a-Bag stall at the Otley Carnival which raised around £200. The Club expresses their deepest thanks to all those (especially fellow Lions) who kindly donated many wonderful soft toys to their appeal. If any Clubs have any spare toys to donate, please do get in touch and they will be put to good use.

Further local success has been seen in their **Annual Crown Green Bowling** event which was won by the Club's Secretary, The **popularity of their bookshop** has grown with some **2,000 books being donated including many valuable ones**. Finally, the Club is proud of their **numerous charitable donations** over the last 12 months including contributions to the **Otley Food Bank and the Otley Community Larder**. The Club's focus is now **quickly switching to their Christmas plans**.

Hornsea District Lions

Hornsea District Lions have made a donation of £7000 to Eastgate Medical Centre to fund new equipment and support an innovative project to detect Prostate cancer in high risk men. The major focus of this funded work is an early detection project for Prostate cancer, targeting men aged 50 – 70 who may have a family history of the disease. Meanwhile, the second part of the donation went towards purchasing dermatoscopes which are advanced handheld cameras that magnify skin lesions for closer inspection. The Club will continue to fund this for 2 years.



Speaking in praise was **Dr Tami Byass** who celebrated the **Lions' support as "instrumental"** and has enabled the practice to try something "new" and hopefully "long lasting". Rather fantastically, one man who was involved in the original trial has already been diagnosed and had curative surgery. Superb, life-changing and life-saving work!

Knaresborough Lions



Another big donation has come from Knaresborough Lions who are keenly supporting the development of a sensory garden at the St Andrews Police Treatment Centre in Harrogate. This has followed the success of the Bobby Dazzler team from the centre who participated in the Club's Great Knaresborough Bed Race and used this to raise money for the garden.

The more than worthy St Andrews Police Treatment Centre is

a charity which shares a role with a **sister establishment in Auchterarder (Scotland)** in providing rehabilitation for emergency services personnel. For more information, **please do visit its website** on www.thepolicetreatmentcentres.org/.



Tickhill & District Lions

The Australian club was so impressed by the work of Darlington Lions in supporting its local community they donated AU\$1,000 (£480)!
