It's hard to picture all of the service delivered by Lions to our communities in the last twelve months, though this newsletter and our social media pages have helped enormously.

From fun filled events that serve and enhance our community life to service campaigns to feed hungry tummies, keeping our environment healthy and beautiful and providing opportunities for self-health management.



One of my first visits this Lionistic year was to our only Leos Club in Aberdeen. Working with Aberdeen Bon Accord Lions they presented an evening to reflect on the difficulties of the blind but also the devices that help overcome the difficulties of lost vision. This remarkable event has stayed with me and was quickly followed by the success for the 11 schools taking part in the ROAR project, our Winning Peace Poster and our Young Ambassador, who will soon to be on her way to the Lions European Young Ambassador finals in Dublin.

At the time of writing, we have had service contact with people 369,864 times, through 1726 events, and given 47,485 hours of volunteer hours. That is likely to be a huge underestimation as only 57% of clubs report on the Portal and whilst that is terribly modest and British it does under-represent the work of this amazing family of Lions in the North of UK.

I leave this office now to take up and champion our Youth projects: ROAR, Young Ambassador, Peace Poster, Young Leaders in service, Youth Exchange and Childsight Vision Screening. So, please get in touch with me if you haven't already,



Ryedale Lions



Ryedale Lions have been reflecting on their recent funding of a number of great causes. The first of these has been their support for the state of the art Sanctuary Spa Room at St Catherine's Hospice in Scarborough. This excellent provision gives users a relaxing experience of their choice with a bath which has mood lighting, surround sound music, bubbles and a full hoist facility all situated in a beautifully dressed room with soothing murals, luxury fittings and fluffy towels.

Further to this, the Club has also donated to key, local projects at their monthly, Club meeting. This included £700 to York Samaritans which will fund this vital service for a week, £340 to York and Scarborough Hospital Charities and £100 to the Friends of Kirkbymoorside School. The meeting also agreed to provide £1,000 to help with the purchase of an adapted all terrain chair for a local youngster.

Lion President, Will Oxley said: "We visited St Catherine's to see the room and meet the staff and were overwhelmed by the strength of support and gratitude for this facility - it really is a game changer. We are privileged to have helped them and back our community through our regular donations."

Rothwell District Lions

Another Club which has been financially boosting their community is Rothwell District Lions who have happily bolstered Hannah House and the Leeds Hospital Charity, Rob Burrow MND Centre by £2500 each. Each year, the Club's President nominates two charities to receive this special grant, an honour which fell to President Harry Boynton, who happily presented the charities' cheques. As pictured, he recently visited Hannah House which is a self-contained 'home away from home' style facility for children with complex health needs.



The Club also held its **first ever auto show** at the beginning of this month. After losing some major events from their calendar since Covid, the Club, **decided to do something new to great success**. They had **60 cars and 5 motorcycles in attendance and look forward to holding it again** next year.

Tickhill and District Lions



Being a Lion is not just about service and meetings – it's also about friendship and community. At Tickhill & District Lions, they value spending quality time together through regular social events with members, families, and friends. Most recently, they enjoyed a wonderful Mediterranean evening at Zaytuna Restaurant in Bawtry.

Derwent Lions

In Derwent, our Lions have been supporting York College in a variety of ways. For example, the College has a cohort of students who don't have English as a first language, with many of them coming to the UK as refugees due to wars and other disasters.

To support these young people to improve their English skills, the Lions volunteered to run 'Sharing Life' sessions. This saw four Lions and groups of young people, play games such as dominoes and cards as

well as having a general chinwag together. These special get-togethers have now been done twice and has became a **multi-generational group who meet regularly** with now around 50 people for the students to meet and chat to, some older and some nearer their own age.

On top of this, the Club has also helped set up a **hygiene bank** for less well-off students with a **donation of** £250 to help fund items for the shop including soap and shampoo. The Lions have also helped link them up with **The York Hygiene Bank** who hopefully can supply them with items in the future.

Darlington Lions



Darlington Lions has also been backing young people in their community through a £5,000 donation to Darlington Association on Disability (DAD).

The local charity plans to spend the funds to support its work with children and young people that attend its **DASH school holiday play schemes which give 170 local children with disabilities the opportunity to have fun** with inclusive and accessible play.

David Thomas of DAD said: "This incredible donation will go a long way in supporting new activities and resources for the children and young people at DASH. The children and young people have already been buzzing with ideas about what fun things we could get to make future sessions even more exciting!"

Darlington Lions President Pat De Martino, who handed over the cheque, said: "DAD and DASH do such good work supporting young people with disabilities in and around Darlington. It is a pleasure for Darlington Lions to help."

May and June have been busy months for the Consett Lions. They spent some great time together during their social evening at Consett Park Bowls Club which gave Lions a chance to try Lawn Bowls; much fun was had by all.

During this time, they have enjoyed hosting a **Pop Up display about Lions** as part of the Club's initiative to reach out to potential new members. They extend their thanks to **Consett Library staff** for hosting them. They were also happy to **make a small donation to Leadgate**
