In Order to inform here is a summary of the essentials of Brass band Marching Contesting. -

There's a Street march - where the band is tested on 'Deportment' At Wetherby The wheel, or turning as a group through 90 degrees at the junction of Bank Street & High Street. Also the smartness of Dress, the spacing between players and how well that is maintained throughout and of course their synchronicity of step.





The Stood Marching Tune Played on the bandstand - Each band is given a short time to set up. Lyres (or Music sheet clamps), used to fix a smaller version of the musical score to the instrument while marching can be dispensed with and a standard music sand used for the next two elements. A chair may be requested



The stood Hymn Like the Stood march these two elements are being judged, or more correctly termed 'adjudicated' on by a AoBBA qualified person, who at Wetherby is sat in an enclosed gazebo. They are ranking each band against those already adjudicated. The Air Training Corp Placard bearer is informing the public by means of his signage to show the Band name and draw number. This visual advise to the audience is to maintain the element of fairness so the adjudicator is judging only on the sound qualities, rather than reputational standing. The Contest Controller is welcoming Bands to the stage, announcing the hymn and march tune to be played by Band Number (whatever it may be). The awards at Wetherby in 2023 were given on each Section.

Much like football leagues each national region, and in our case it was Yorkshire Region and North East Region, compete within their section. there was a first and a runner up in the following. Championship, First, Second & Third Section. there was also Training or Youth Section. A separate prize was awarded for Best 3rd Section or lower, best Deportment (awarded to a band) and best Instrumentalist (awarded to a player, usually a solo cornet player)


