After a recent cardiac diagnosis, **FA qualified referee Jacob** writes: *“Being forced to stop something you absolutely love is extremely hard. I believe I’m a positive person, but it did make me think more about the **challenges some people face every day with their mental health.** With **1 in 5 young people from 8-25 years old experiencing problems with their mental health,** I have recently focused my attention on ways to **improve mental health and well-being for young people,** and have started by looking within my own school community.”*

Going forward to represent us at the annual weekend of networking, fun, games and interviews for the **candidates from all 8 districts of British Isles Lions**, our Jacob was somewhat disruptive when he ‘persuaded’ Council Chair that a session in the Karaoke room was just what they needed to help them relax before their formal interviews...they all returned late for lunch...it’s a teenage thing!

Thank you for representing us Jacob, thank you for being such a sport on the day and good luck with your BIG IDEA which is now supported by your **District Young Ambassador grant of £500**

Rothwell District Lions



We start this month's collection of tales with a **really touching story from our brilliant Rothwell District Lions**

Recently, the Lions were approached by a lady who had sadly lost her daughter aged just 18 to suicide. She asked if they might be able to **contribute toward a tree being planted in a local park** which would memorialise not just her daughter but others who had sadly taken their own lives, or might do so in the future.

As you can imagine, the Club was only too happy to contribute to this amazing project alongside others including the **Two Pointers pub and The Maple Café**. Collectively, **£1500 was raised** which went towards the erecting of the **beech tree as well as a plaque in Springhead Park**. An **utterly marvellous bit of community work** - excellent Rothwell District Lions.

Elmet Lions

Traditionally, the **Elmet Lions Interpub Quiz** is run in October – however a fixture for Leeds FC meant that every pub who had entered had to withdraw because most had a TV and the game was being viewed. Due to this, the quiz was moved to January 2026 with **9 pubs taking part**.



For those not in the know, the quiz starts at 8:30pm and each pub is read 100 questions in 30 minutes. Each pub has a spokesperson who has the whole pub as their team and they say the answers through the spokesperson. The pub that has the most correct answers in the shortest time wins. Yarm District Lions

Raising funds for good causes is a big part of Lionism. 1 Club doing just this is **Yarm District Lions who have been working hard** in their local Tesco store.

Over a weekend, nearly all members of the Club including **new Lion Faides** joined in the effort for the **Great North Air Ambulance Service**. During this period, the **Club's collective effort was able to raise £583** which will make a big difference to their community. The Great North Air Ambulance Service is based just 2 miles outside Yarm and is **aiming to raise £2.5 million** to buy a new helicopter - **the Lions have made a hearty contribution to this goal.**

Helping another great cause is Darlington Lions Club which has donated **£500 to Goodwill Children's Homes**, a charity which runs **3 residential homes for destitute and orphaned children** in Southern India.

The money from this great contribution will go **to Thandigudi, a home for children aged between 5 and 11**, which also has its own primary school. The Club has proudly supported this residential home for many years. and also gave a further **£500 to Wilmslow Wells For Africa** which provides clean water, hygiene and sanitation in drought-stricken areas of Africa.

Also making a **big difference at a local school** is Filey Lions Club.

On World Book Day, **Lion President Julie** (AKA the Mad Hatter) and **Roary** (AKA The Lion King), went along to join most of the school at a special assembly.
