Record-breaking year for Santa's Sleigh

Ryedale Lions Club has announced a record-breaking year for its Santa Sleigh collections around the towns and villages of North Ryedale.

The big reveal was made live on Radio York with the total raised reaching £12,500 - £3,000 up on the previous record. This was despite the issues of COVID, Storm Arwen and cancellation of the switch-on of the Christmas lights in Pickering.

Since putting out an appeal for volunteer collectors and sponsors to help with and support the sleigh in November, Radio York has worked with Ryedale Lions and broadcast from the sleigh on four nights. This included the night they lost Santa in Thornton le Dale and an interesting revelation about where Santa lives, also picked up on BBC TV's Have I Got News for You.

Some 40 volunteers have helped with collections with St Catherine's Hospice, SASH, Pickering Beavers and Kirkbymoorside Library sending out teams to work as elves along side Lions members. Sponsors came forward for many of the nights and benefited from publicity on social media and a scrolling display on the sleigh.

Feedback has been excellent, summed up by a resident in Nawton who said: "The children have had everything Continued overleaf

cancelled this year, school parties, the nativity play, carol concerts but Ryedale Lions brought Christmas to the village -thank you".



Ryedale Lions President, Frank Hayward, said "This is a tremendous result and we are so grateful for everyone who has worked with us to raise this sum which will all be donated to local good causes. Sleigh coordinator, Ben Hayes, added: "Santa's Sleigh is a traditional part of Christmas in Ryedale and the reaction in the towns and villages was fantastic. Ryedale Lions feel working with Radio York has been a real boost and are delighted by the exposure it has given to the whole movement.

Press Officer Will Oxley said "In addition to the live broadcasts we have done interviews and updates through December which all raises awareness of what Lions do." Will went on "The revelation that Santa has a home at Ryedale, picked up on national TV, should surprise no one, he probably lives next door to God".
