## **Lions Working Together**



For a long time, Minster Lions Club of York has been sending children's books to the Lions Clubs of Sri Lanka to help them distribute the books throughout the schools and libraries after a recent terrible tsunami and civil war. This 'Library in a Box' project was started by PDG Lion George Bennett MJF and has, so far, sent over 200,000 books to the children of Sri Lanka.

The recent, incredible collection of 180 boxes (containing 16,812 children's books) has long been ready for sending and, after a plea for help, the books were boxed and ready to be shipped in only 1 hour.

Minister Lions express their sincere thanks to the Lions Clubs of **Derwent, Easingwold and Huddersfield** as well as volunteers from the **Lions Den Shed in Keighley** who worked in a very efficient and friendly manner.

A truly fantastic effort from everyone who turned up and already the shipment is on its way by ship to Columbo, Sri Lanka, and is due there just before Christmas.

## **Tales from our Clubs**

#### **Tickhill and District Lions**



Tickhill and District Lions brought frightful fun to Tickhill Cricket Club with a Halloween celebration which featured a lively funfair, a roaring firepit and a host of ghosts, ghouls, and skeletons. Visitors also joined in with spooky games such as 'Guess the Guts' and the 'Eyeball and Spoon Race', whilst a volunteer witch ran a spooky storytelling session in the tent. A great, team effort!

Unfortunately, the local Club (and members beyond) were deeply saddened by the **passing of Lion Barry Hoggart,** a dedicated member since 1985 and who was approaching his 40th year of Lionism. Barry served in many roles, including Club

President in 2007, and was an **enormously valued member of the Welfare Committee**. His commitment to service never wavered - only last year **he helped source**, **pack**, **and distribute nearly 100 Christmas hampers** for families in need, personally delivering several with his wife. Beyond Lions, Barry was a teacher, keen cyclist, active walker, and member of both the local arts club and choir. **His kindness, energy, and friendship enriched our Club and community**. **He will be greatly missed**.

### **Ryedale Lions**

Meanwhile, an annual event returned once more to Pickering on the weekend of the 10th October after a 6-year hiatus. The event was the reinvention of the popular Pickering War weekend, which has been renamed the 1940's Weekend. There was dancing and singing in the streets, with many visitors getting into the spirit of the event by dressing in clothes appropriate to the era. The Ryedale Lions loved taking part in this historical hysteria by running a tombola which raised over £250 for their local community.

Beyond this great event, the Club was **presented with a coveted award** from

Lions International after receiving the \$50 per member average banner patch, which recognised their continuing support of Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) in 2024-2025. Lions are now increasingly called to meet the needs of vulnerable populations across the world and to help to improve the lives of our international community. #### **Teesdale and District Lions**



Earlier this year, Teesdale and District Club members Suzanne Hunter and Victoria Emmerson were approached for sponsorship in setting up a **Park Run in Barnard Castle**. Park Run, founded in 2004 is a **free**, **5km community event** where you can walk, jog, run, volunteer or spectate every Saturday morning. There are now nearly 900 such events in the UK.


Organiser Steve Bage visited a Club meeting and explained why he needed approx. £5000 to register, set up and equip 'The Barnard

Castle Demesnes Park Run'. Teesdale Club was 1 of 9 major sponsors and turned out in force to support the inaugural event on Saturday 11th October; Club members have also pledged to support the weekly event with marshalling duties.



#### **Dumfries Lions**

In a similar, sporting style, 12 teams have competed in the **Annual Curling Bonspiel** held on the 8th and 9th of November at the Dumfries Ice Bowl. Winning the High Road contest was the **Dumfries Curling Club** whilst **The Galloway Stars** were victorious in the Low Road section. Meanwhile, the **Scottish Otters** received the Jim McCormack Memorial Trophy. The successful event was held with the deepest of thanks to **Graham Sloan and his staff** for their work at preparing the ice and generally supporting the contest.



Another trophy winner at the Club was **Erin McCluskey**, a senior pupil at Dumfries Academy, who has been awarded the **Dumfries Lions Club Centenary Bowl**. Erin is a great ambassador for the Academy volunteers in the school to assist younger pupils and staff and also charity events in the wider community. **A very worthy winner!** 

### **Boroughbridge Lions**



ROAR is an important and fun bit of service for our Clubs and has seen many schools take part including **Boroughbridge Primary school**. After 5 afternoon sessions, Club members attended a **stunning 'showcase'** of superb ideas where individual groups presented their ideas for a 'world changing idea'. All presentations were judged based upon **best advert and jingle**, **best model and an overall winner**.

After many wonderful ideas, the final winners were a group of boys who

came up with a way to keep plants watered whilst away on holiday without the need for vials in the soil. Their idea was to attach a small dehumidifier by a tube to the soil surrounding the plant. The invention would extract water from the air which would then be used to water the plant. The group was presented with medals and wrist bands to celebrate their achievement whilst all the children in the class received certificates and a Lion bar (donated by Morrisons). The Club also attached an inspirational, 'Thank you' message with the Lions logo to each Lion bar.

### **City of Dundee Lions Club**

Facebook is such a powerful tool for our Clubs and Lionism across the globe. One such superpower it has is in its ability to help us **share our successes** with a wider audience and get people talking about our work. For example, the **Dundee Museum of Transport** took to Facebook to **celebrate** their local Lions who had donated £200 towards their forthcoming Tram exhibition.



Within this post, the Museum acknowledged the 'big difference' which the

Club's contribution had made to **support Dundee's tram heritage** and bring the story of the city's transport to life. It also commented on the **Club's 40 years of supporting local causes** and **encouraged people to join** the Club. Whilst social media can be a tricky tool, which does have some risks, it is great to see it **being used as a force for good.** 



### **Darlington Lions**



As the nights get colder, lots of vulnerable people are increasingly put into a more challenging and dangerous situation. In Darlington, our Lions have been doing their bit to **help people keep warm in their homes** this winter by a donation of **100 Winter Warm Packs**.

Each of these packs contains a fleece blanket, socks, hat, gloves, coffee, tea, porridge and soup, and some useful information about financial and practical help available, as well as a guide to activities in the town. 50 will

therefore be distributed to older vulnerable people by **Age UK (North Yorkshire and Darlington)**, **The Well Community Centre and the local branch of Alzheimer's Society**, and 50 by **Kings Church Food Bank** to support homeless people moving into accommodation or people who are struggling to afford heating this winter.

Caroline Todd, Manager of King Church Food Bank said: "This is a fantastic effort by the Lions Club to help vulnerable people who may be homeless moving into accommodation or unable to access heating." Following this great act of service will be the Lions providing 100 Christmas food parcels for struggling families and by them hosting a Christmas party for older people. Great work by all!

### **Knaresborough Lions**

Lionism is a great way to make friends and build bonds between communities and Clubs. For example, the Lions from Knaresborough recently attended a general knowledge quiz organised by Boroughbridge Lions. Further to this, not only did they have a fun time, the lucky Lions lineup of Lions Bob Godsell, Tony Pedel, Lyn Nudds, Bernadette Reid and Stewart Reid - went on to win! They thank their friends at Boroughbridge Lions for organising the event. Here's hoping for more get-togethers in the near future.



### **Filey Lions**



Lots of service has been conducted in Filey over November which included some big bangs! The Club **welcomed over 3500 people** to their **community bonfire & firework display** which saw families from the town and all over the country joining them.

The Club has been supporting their community by a **donation of crash mats** to a newly formed local kickboxing club and helped Filey Methodist Church deliver **100 Operation**Christmas Child shoe boxes for distribution to children and young people who will not receive anything on Christmas Day. They also **spent the day with their local primary school for Roar and have run an art competition**. They intend to use the artwork to

design a greetings card/note for use by the Lions when taking gifts or needing to say thank you.

Going forward, they are **looking forward to their upcoming Christmas Lunch** for 100 lovely people over the age of 85 and **helping Santa bring some festive joy to the great folk of Filey!** 



### **Rothwell District Lions**

Helping children is an important part of our service and in Rothwell, they are doing just that. To start with, they have just given £500 to Cash for Kids which is dedicated to giving disadvantaged children and young people across the UK the chance to thrive. The Lions are proud to step in where it's needed most - tackling poverty, illness, and neglect, easing the challenges of additional needs, and offering a helping hand to families with nowhere else to turn.



As a festive thank you to those they serve, the Club is once again **holding a free pantomime** for local children and their parents/guardians this coming January. Due to **increased demand**, **2 performances will be going ahead** in order to accommodate all of the people who want to attend. Although a £2 deposit is required (which is fully refundable), this is only done to deter people from booking tickets and then deciding not to attend the performance without notice. **Well done Rothwell District Lions!**
