I have now visited 5 clubs and I enjoy each for the different models of meeting set up, the range of activity and most of all the service


that is available to the communities they serve.

Royal Visit to the Doncaster Royal Infirmary 19 th September 2023.

Her Royal Highness Princess Anne the Princess Royal visited the Doncaster Royal Infirmary and the newly installed Serenity Suite.

This was the first Royal visit for 10 years and was organised by the Royal College of Nursing. The visit, as expected, came with the level of security you would expect for such an occasion and was professionally controlled by the South Yorkshire Police.

Attendance at the event was by invitation only and Lion Ron Lindsay PMJF was invited to attend and represent Tickhill & District Lions Club, Thorne Rural Lions Club on behalf of the Lions Club International Foundation. Three other charitable organisations also attended, they were, the Albermarle Organisation, the Sands Charity and a young mother form Worksop in Bassetlaw who had lost a child in November 2022 and had carried out a significant amount of fundraising for the project.



When the Princess Royal came into the Serenity Suite, I was introduced to her with the usual protocol and etiquette, she shook my hand and immediately noticed the Lions Badge on my blazer, she immediately commented that she knew the Lions did a lot of great charitable work. I informed the Princess how Tickhill and District combined efforts with Thorne Rural Lions had raised approximately £20,000, then followed this up with a Matching Grant application to LCIF Headquarters in the USA, thereby doubling our joint donation to almost £40,000. The Princess Royal was suitably impressed.

The Princess shook hands and had a word with everyone present, taking care not to leave anyone out. Everyone present was extremely impressed. The Princess Royal was invited to unveil an official plaque recording the Royal Visit and the opening of the Serenity Suite.

The Princess was officially thanked for visiting the Doncaster Royal Infirmary and opening the Serenity Continued in next column

Suite, to which she immediately responded, "It is not me you should be thanking, it should be all those who have supported the project by fundraising to make it all possible".

This comment really hit the point and made our efforts and efforts of other organisations greatly appreciated and worthwhile. Official photos will follow after approval by the Palace.

Finally, I was extremely proud to represent Tickhill & District and Thorne Rural Lions Clubs on behalf of the Lions Clubs International Foundation, it was most certainly a day to remember.

Dear All

Welcome to the first of this years Lions in Sight Update.

First - just a gentle reminded - **World Sight Day** this year is 12th October 2023 and I very much hope that each and every club in our district will be able to do something to recognise the day.

This could just be as easy as Sharing a Message on social media – 'This is World Sight Day, get your eyes tested', and/or upload a WSD photo image on the Facebook cover page or timeline.

Or, downloading WSD material from the iapb website (www.iapb.org) and hold an 'Awareness Raising Event' on 12th October.

Or download photos of the things Clubs do to support visually impaired people. (Talking Newspaper, Volunteering, befriending, IT etc)

I have already heard from several Clubs about what they are doing re World Sight Day and also about some of the exciting sight loss related things they are all doing throughout the year, but we really must ensure that we are capturing everything that each Club is doing re Vision and get to the top of the service leader board on Sight....

To that end I would ask each Club to

- a) log number (maybe not exact) of glasses recycled.
- b) log numbers of TN editions produced to include how many actual copies go out to people, how many Lions volunteers plus volunteer hours.
- c) log other sight related activity and volunteer hours.

with the new Lions In Sight poster and an updated Project Ideas sheet. Also available is a power point visual awareness session and the Sight Roadshow presentation – all good for sharing with Clubs.

Activity re **recycling spectacles** is at an all time high. Many thanks to everyone for all they do. I do know that at some time in the future HQ will be asking for information regarding exactly where we all collect our recycled spectacles from, so something we need to be thinking about. On the members area of Lions Clubs International website are details of 'how why where and when' re Spectacle Recycling.

In looking to the future we are hoping to develop new national partnerships with sight loss related organisation in UK, especially thinking about how we as individual Lions Clubs can then support and volunteer with them locally. We are hoping to partner with Visually Impaired Bowlers England (and hopefully Wales and Scotland), and the Royal School for Blind Children. Any other suggestions of organisations we could work with would be most welcome.

And finally I would remind you of Lions Sight Savers Trust, which over many years has been able to make considerable financial contributions to Sight Savers to support the great work they do across India and Africa. Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) where from July 2022 to May 2023 they awarded 83 vision related grants totalling US\$7,580,006 across the world aiming to prevent avoidable blindness and improve the quality of life of people who are blind and visually impaired.

SIGHT is a key priority for Lions Clubs International, and together we can make a difference.

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Wetherby & Knaresborough Lions in Partnership

A man appeared at a folk club in Wetherby asking for £20,000 and didn't get thrown out!

His name was Bob, a retired lorry driver from Knaresborough and he had just returned from his eighth trip to Ukraine delivering humanitarian aid to the town of Volodymyr. He had become friendly with the mayor and asked if there was anything special they desperately needed – the reply was a fire engine! Specifically, one with a high-rise telescopic ladder as most of the accommodation in the town is in Soviet era tower blocks with no lift and only one staircase. A rocket attack on a lower floor would trap those in the upper flats with no means of escape.

The sums involved were more than one organisation could be reasonably expected to raise. The folk club, together with Leeds Ukrainian Society were organising fund raising events and asking for help from any other groups.

Wetherby Lions member Tim Ritson was in the audience and after a brief discussion with Bob decided this was something the Lions could become involved with and requested at the next Lions' meeting that they should support the project. This was happily agreed and Knaresborough Lions were invited to combine forces with Wetherby. The clubs, working together with other organisations, proved an unstoppable force and "Joyce" the fire engine will shortly be on her way to Ukraine.

Library In A Box

We are appealing for unwanted children's books, suitable for children between 4 and 18 years, to be collected and then sent on for the children of Sri Lanka.

Minster Lions Club set up a project named as Library in a Box, following the tsunami which caused utter devastation to countries in the Indian Ocean back in 2006.

It was discovered after schools that Lions had financed and helped to rebuild; that they had no books to educate the children, due them being destroyed, hence the late District Governor George Bennett, following a visit to Sri Lanka, initiated the project.

Since then, close to 200,000 books have been collected, packed by Minster Lions, and despatched over the years since, via container to the Lions Clubs of Sri Lanka.

They have inventoried every book into categories and despatched to schools and libraries throughout the country, which apart from the early devastation, was affected by civil war. Since then the covid pandemic and political unrest has caused ongoing upheaval causing particular suffering to the education of children.

It is an ongoing very successful project, and we need more books, so please keep collecting for us
