This section is focused on inspirational and funny stories from Lions across our District. In keeping with this and in honour of the late Lion George Morgan, I have decided to dedicate this first page to a letter which he wrote before moving on to Higher Service. We will never forget his long, inspirational service.



Life as a Lion

I was first introduced to Lions in December 1966 by Lion George Hubbard MBE, MJF, who invited Jeanne and I to the Wakefield Lions monthly dinner meeting after which we all gathered round a large table to make up food parcels for the elderly. It was during this event that Lion George suggested that I should become a Lion to which I agreed. On the night I was inducted it was suggested that Wakefield should try and form a club in Pontefract and in April 1967 I became the first member of the Pontefract Club and we eventually chartered on the 8th June 1967.

Since then, I have served in **three clubs**, Pontefract, where I served 12 times as President as well as doing Secretary, Treasurer and PR.I have also served as **President in Wakefield** where I was honoured to be presented with an MJF and President of Castleford where I also completed 22 years as Club Treasurer.

In 1977. along with Lion Ernest Copley we formed the first Lioness Club in the British Isles and my wife Jeanne became Charter President. Altogether, she served 14 times as President and during this time she received a MJF. She was a member of the MD105 Lioness Advisory Body and served as Multiple District 105 Lioness Chairman in 2006.

I was soon appointed to cabinet by PDG Ian Wood as PR Officer to represent 105C on the MD PR team helping to organize the International Convention held in Birmingham in 1998 and I have served on Cabinet ever since in various rolls such as Zone Chairman, PR Sight First Two Coordinator and Twenty two years as Newsletter Editor.

In 2005/2006, I had the honour to serve 105C as District Governor and I had a fantastic time meeting and making many new friends. This was the year after tsunami in Sri Lanka where PDG George Bennett did some extraordinary work during his year as Governor, and I agreed that George should carry this on during my year. During a later visit to Sri Lanka PDG George was presented with two plaques by District Governor Rohantha De Fonseka MJF, one for George and the other for me, in recognition of the work carried out by District 105C.

Eventually the Lionesses were told they all had to become Lions but their service as Lionesses would count as service to Lions, over ten thousand refused and they have formed a completely independent organisation worldwide. Pontefract Lionesses decided to join Castleford & Pontefract District Lions and it has proved to be a great success. Two years ago, PDG David Wilson presented PDG with his 55 yrs. Certificate and Lion Jeanne with her 45 year certificate.

Because of ill health both Jeanne and I can no longer do as much for the Lions, but **our two daughter Lion Michelle Nicholson MJF and Lion Jeannette Morgan MJF (both former Leos) are still very much involved.**

Finally, I would like to thank everyone for all your help over the years without it I could not have produced the newsletter and I hope Luke enjoys doing it as much as I did.
