

Darlington Lions



In Darlington, the Lions have continued to focus on Prostate Cancer by delivering **25 A4 and 25 A3 Prostate Cancer UK posters** to places where there are high concentrations of men, such as the trade counters of building material suppliers, sports clubs and men's sheds. In around 6 hours, the Club visited **13 trade centres, 8 sports clubs, 4 community centres and Darlington Men's Shed** with all but one being able to take a poster.

In around half of the centres, Lions met staff who either had prostate cancer, knew someone who had prostate cancer, had tried to get a test at their GPs and were refused, or were worried about prostate cancer and interested in getting a test.

In late June, the West Yorkshire market town Wetherby came together for its annual **'Drovers' Day'** which remembers the times when, **for over 200 years, 10s of 1000s of cattle were walked by drovers** from Scotland to southern markets via Wetherby by its crossing of the river Wharfe.

This year, the sun shone and the crowds, 1000 strong or more, were entertained by 20 brass bands from the north of England who marched and played through the town for over 4 hours, competing in **'The Drovers' Brass Band Hymn and Marching Contest'**. The Scottish connection was played by the **City of York Pipe Band** who performed whilst the crowd raised a glass of 'Drovers Return' Ale.

The event also saw an **indoor and outdoor market with street musical entertainers and the 'Feast of Folk'** where 3 folk bands pleased the crowd at the 'Engine Shed' concert venue.

The Lions remain proud to work closely with **The Wetherby Bandstand Trust** to bring this day to their community and remain grateful for the **wonderful support by the public; local businesses; Leeds City Council; Wetherby Town Council and Geneva Instruments** who provide superb prizes. **Next year's event is planned for Sunday 14th June 2026**



Colne Valley Lions



Visiting and organising events is a must for any Club and Colne Valley Lions have been doing their fair share. In early June, they held their **annual Marsden 10 miler race**, in conjunction with **Stadium Runners Club**. A very impressive number of runners took part, which **exceeded 100**, all of whom admired the **gorgeous scenery** en route as well as the even more **spectacular cake table** when they got back to Race HQ!

After this, the Lions had a **successful, summer concert in St James' Church, Slaithwaite** where they were treated by **pianist Patrick Townsend, Two Gates Junior School choir, Slaithwaite Brass Band and Colne Valley Male Voice choir**. Not only was it a musical night, it also **managed to raise £595** from the retiring collection.

Once in July, the Club's **first PSA blood testing session** saw the **60 places being fully booked up within 48 hours**. The Club is thankful to the **funeral collection from PDG John N Daker** and last year's **Beer Festival** which made it financially possible. **An additional £270 from a voluntary collection was also raised**. Lastly, despite some, slightly soggy weather, the Club enjoyed the **classic car show, arranged by Slaithwaite Classic Car Club** where **10 cars and a tractor braved the elements!**

Denby Dale District Lions



Another Club which has had a **hectic month with a number of events** is the Denby Dale District Lions. At the end of June, the Lions teamed up with the **neighbouring Holme Valley Lions at the well established agricultural, Honley Show**. The joint Lions stand offered a **coconut shy, a tombola and 'splat the rat'**. This creative offering proved to be popular and ensured a great day of fundraising for both Clubs.

After this, the Club held their annual **Scarecrow Trail** which was run with the theme of 'Animal Adventures'. The trail saw a **massive 35 scarecrows** put on display around the village as well as a **BBQ, kids tombola, face-painting, raffle and live music**. This fantastic weekend was a big hit which **brought people from far and wide and smashed last year's fundraising effort**. During the event, the Club even managed to do a **cheque presentation to the Denby Dale Men's Shed** who are moving into the disused village church and need funds to help make it watertight.

Last but not least, the Club also ran its first ever **Grant Funding Programme** which **attracted 17 applications from local charities and community groups** and enrolled **2 local schools into the Lions Roar 2025 programme**. **A busy month indeed!**

Elmet Lions

Also working closely with the community are the Elmet Lions who have been **helping Sherburn Town Council collect charitable funds during their recent Party in the Park**. Armed with their collection buckets and card readers, this big effort was all for two excellent causes – **Sherburn Larder** (which serves around 180 families per week) and **Emilia's Run** (a pupil at a local school had passed away with all the funds raised going towards her chosen charity of **Therapy Dogs Nationwide**).



The Club has also been focused on **collecting empty blister packs** for over 3 years and have been carrying on despite Lions HO in Birmingham saying that they no longer had a recycling partner. Not to be deterred, Immediate Past President Maggie and the Lions were **determined to ensure that the highly disposable packs could still be recycled**.

Fortunately, two companies **MY Group** (formerly Mytum and Selby) recycle empty blister packs whilst **Kingspan** helped fund the recycling by paying for the delivery and collection of the pallet. Overall, **14 large bags** have been collected over the last year with these being substantial enough to **fill up a pallet box** which was taken away for recycling. Elmet Lions will continue to collect these empty blister packs for a long time yet, saving them from going to landfill or being burnt.

This doesn't half show what sheer determination, creative thinking and a 'can do' attitude can achieve.



Lions are **incredible people who selflessly dedicate** themselves to helping others. Often, this is done without celebration but it is so important to recognise our efforts. One Lion who is rightly in receipt of well deserved praise, is that of **Sue Johnson** who recently was presented with a '**Certificate of Appreciation**' award from the District.



Sue has been a **Lion for 6 years** and in that time has become a **trustee of the District and her Club**. Beyond this, she was **instrumental in setting up Boroughbridge Community Larder** which she now runs and she **also organises the Boroughbridge Summer Fête, the Club Easter Egg Raffle and the Christmas Tombola**. Additionally, she proudly **serves as the Club Membership and Social Officer**.

Upon receiving the award, Lion Sue said: "I was surprised and felt very honoured to receive the "District Governor's Certificate of Appreciation" and badge for the work I've done with Boroughbridge Community Larder whilst also supporting the Club and District.
