Darlington Lions Club recently launched an initiative to give men free prostate cancer tests and in so doing so saved the lives of two of their own members who took the tests and were later told by specialists that if they hadn't done so the outcome could have been very different for them.

The project started with the club raising £6,000. to stage an event at the town's Masonic Hall where men could get a free prostate - specific antigen blood test to spot early signs of cancer.

When the event was cancelled because of the pandemic, the club wasn't put off - instead it used the money to buy home test kits ... and the rest as they say is history.

The club was awarded the winning prestigious Northern Echo County Durham Health & Wellbeing award which is also sponsored by Durham County Council and the NHS Darlington.
