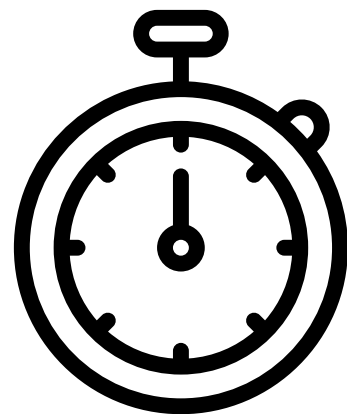

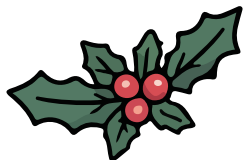

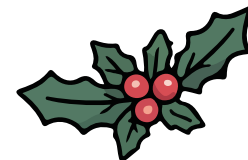

Festive Tales



In true festive style, the **Knaresborough's Lions** took part in the **town's annual Christmas Tree Festival**. At this 'tree-mendous' event, the Lions decorated their own tree with items dedicated to the Club's activity in the town. They were **one of 100 community groups, businesses and schools** to contribute decorated trees, which were displayed in St John's Church during December.

After last year's debut featuring pom-pom lions, Santa and a Message in a Bottle theme, Knaresborough returned for 2025 with a display inspired by the Town's most iconic event: **the Bed Race**. **Lion Lynn Nudd** (seen here with her David) provided the design, imagination and hard work that created the 2025 contribution. All this work did prove to be worthwhile as approximately, **1000 people visited the display** on the first weekend. Not only that but the Club (who also provided Lionistic material) were able to handout **28 MIABs** as well.

Pocklington & District Lions have been decorating their own Christmas Tree and did so in order to help promote the LCI in the Hull area. **Beverley Minster's annual Christmas Tree Festival** sees 150+ beautifully decorated trees placed into its stunning medieval building for 10 days this December.



This year, the tree was adorned with **Lions emblems including Message in a bottle, lots of Lions and covered the tree in Blue and Gold Baubles**. All of these were guided by a **Lions' star**. They extend their grateful thanks to **Western Wolds Men in Sheds CIO** who helped them by cutting wooden stars and Christmas tree emblems.

During the weeks before Christmas, the Lions were very busy too as they took **Rudolf, Santa and his sleigh around the Pocklington & Market Weighton area**. With the help of **Pocko (their Mascot), Santa and his Elves** - the Club held numerous **street runs, been to High Street Festivals, held supermarket collections, Santa Grottos, teatime and a story with Santa, and Santa's Special Needs Grotto**.





Adding to the festive atmosphere, Wetherby and District Lions have given their **sleigh a new sound system and new lights**. With this new technical boost, the sleigh has been on many journeys this festive period around **Wetherby and Kirk Deighton**. Santa has also **visited Morrisons, Primrose Lane Primary School in Boston Spa and the Engine Shed in Wetherby** where Lindisfarne were performing.

Working with other businesses, the Lions were able to support **Christmas boxes for over 60 deserving families in Wetherby** and help with **Christmas lunches for senior citizens** in the local villages

of Bramham and Boston Spa. Their famous **Dickensian Market** was on the 14th December too with indoor and outdoor artisan stalls; choirs; music; the sleigh and of course Santa! All monies raised from the Market and sleigh rides will be going towards their **Midwinter lunch and party in January**.

In Keighley, the Lions have also been very busy this Christmas period. Working closely with **Bradford Lions and Bradford Museums and Galleries**, the Club held **6 extremely successful grottos** over 3 glorious weekends. The first weekend had the special grotto held at the **Bradford Industrial Museum** whilst the remaining sessions were at **Cliffe Castle**.



During this period, the Club held **14 Santa sleighs** throughout the town and surrounding areas which were backed by members, volunteers and local Scouting groups.

Overall, the Club has done all it can to reach out to as many people as possible. It has ensured that Santa has travelled far and wide locally including to local dinners, supermarkets and schools. **Collectively, around 2000 children will have seen or visited Santa over Christmas - not bad at all!**



Teesdale and District Lions have been full steam ahead with their grottos too this year as they held theirs at The Station in Richmond.

Rather surprisingly, Santa wasn't the only famous person there as the Lions (and the big man himself) were joined by former **Prime Minister Rishi Sunak and his wife Akshata** alongside the daughter of the Station's CEO.

Rishi chatted to the team about the local Lions Clubs and remembered attending a **PSA Screening being held by Darlington Lions earlier this year**. He knew a lot about the work of Lions throughout the UK which is really great to hear!

After he left (*and I am sure gave Santa his own handwritten Christmas list*), Santa got back to meeting and chatting to the local children and receiving their wish lists. **A memorable visit for all involved!**

Tales from our Clubs

Boroughbridge Lions



Quiz nights are fantastic fun and can prove to be lucrative for our charitable purposes.

Recently, for example, the Lions in Boroughbridge organised such an evening for Club members and friends to raise funds for the Club. The event was held at the local Sports Association pavilion where a bar was set up and food supplied by a local Hotel. A raffle was also held and over **seventy people** attended. **The event was a great success and over £600 was raised.**

Following this, the Club put some of their funds to really good use by **supporting their local Primary School**. They were very happy to chip-in to help the school purchase an **outdoor bench for the Key Stage One playground**. This has been very well received by students and teachers alike - **great work Lions!**

Another Club which has been using its money to support good causes is Dumfries. For example, in one go, they **donated £700 to four local organisations** which included the **Summerhill Community Centre, The Food Train, First Base and the The Queen of the South Community Trust**.

Further to this, the Lions have given **£500 to The Airts Community Centre** to help them continue their good work in Sanquhar especially at Christmas time. Additionally, **£500 was given to the local Chest, Stroke and Heart Support Group** and the **Fire and Rescue Service** to support their

Drive Through Santa's Grotto. Similarly, **Cash for Kids has been given a boost of £500** which will be spent providing gifts and other items for local children. Finally, **£250 has gone to Solway Disability Support** in recognition of the excellent work they do and a **new sewing machine** has been provided to the sewing group known as the 'Sewcial Stitchers', who meet at Locharbriggs Social Club

Dumfries Lions

In a similarly generous mood is Yarm District Lions Club who have donated **£6,000 to local charities and families in need**.

The Club distributed **£20 food vouchers**, via its members and Stockton and Billingham Social Services, to more than **125 families and individuals** to help them buy food over the festive period. It also donated money to **2 food banks and to the Salvation Project** which helps families in the Thornaby area. **6 local charities** also received donations to help them over Christmas.

Funding for the donations have come from the **Club's Christmas fundraising Appeal** as well as events such as the **Yarm Fun Run and Ingleby Barwick Fun Run** earlier this year. **As Club President Ron Hall** states, "We have to **work all year** to achieve these donations but **it's been a good year's work** and we are **pleased to be able to help people in need this Christmas**."



Backing the community via much needed donations is also something which Tickhill and District Lions were proud to continue to do this year. This was achieved via the distribution of a **record number of hampers - 100** - which went to families and individuals across their community.

Within these hampers were **2,000 individual items** (enough to fill six cars to the rafters!) which were collated by a number of volunteers including several non-members. Once compiled, they were distributed to those in need who had been highlighted by the Club's Welfare Committee and other local leaders.



The Club has found this project was both **deeply rewarding** and **were delighted to continue their tradition** of spreading festive cheer and practical assistance. **They thank everyone who contributed, volunteered, or supported the effort.** Together, they have **certainly made a meaningful difference to our neighbours this Christmas.**

Consett Lions



Hamper donations are a good way to make a positive difference to those we serve. In Consett, they have been donating their own special ones to locals. Containing tea, coffee and sweet treats - their '**Refreshment hampers**' have gone down a storm with the residents of **Glenroyd and Victoria House.**

Additionally, the **Club's Town Raffle 2025 Draw** was made with 50 prizes ranging from a tub of sweets to a £200 cash prize all of which had been donated by individuals, groups and organisations. Musical entertainment was provided by special guests, **the Biking Vikings**, who raise money for **Brain Tumor Research.**

Ryedale Lions and Darlington Lions

In both Ryedale and Darlington, the Lions have also been handing out hampers and food parcels to local people.

Ryedale Lions (*left*) have worked in conjunction with a local trader in Pickering, The Old Weigh, to provide **25 Christmas hampers** for local vulnerable residents. The proprietor **Toni Pape-Hodgson** has put together these hampers for the last 3 years, **working together with Lion Frank Hayward**, to ensure that the hampers are filled with items that will be enjoyed over the festival period.



Meanwhile, Darlington Lions packed and donated **100 Christmas food parcels** to older and vulnerable people in need. The parcels, which contain a host of staple items, **were assembled and delivered to charities, community centres, schools and churches for distribution.**

Huddersfield Lions



Huddersfield Lions have also been very generous with **hampers** as they have handed them out to **8 different schools**. These are to be used to help them to raise their own funds and have been warmly received. The Club has also organised a **special visit for Santa** to a local care home to **deliver some personalised gifts** to the residents.

A new monthly milestone has also been raised for the **Club's spectacle collection** which saw **5000 collated in November and 6000 in December**. The Club is hoping that this trend continues as, if it does, it could lead to a **grand total of 72,000 a year**.

Keighley Lions

Hospitals and their staff are so important for our communities. All of us, at some point, will need to use them and we should always be grateful for the role they play. In Keighley, the Club has decided to acknowledge and reward those who work at their **local hospital through a big, biscuit donation**.

Joined by myself, Club Vice President Robert Payne gave out around **40 boxes of sweet treats to the staff** who form the backbone of Airedale Hospital. From the porters to the security team to the communication experts and caterers, all the background team (who are often overlooked) were treated.



Additionally, the Club has made sure that **Santa has made a visit too**. Over two sessions, the jolly, red man loved popping by to the hospital which included the **hospital's nursery and Children's ward**. During these sessions, he proudly handed out **presents and selection boxes** to the ill children and (of course) the staff too. **Keighley Lions Club is delighted and proud to back their local hospital and thank the staff for everything they do**.

Derwent Lions



Every Christmas, our friends at Derwent Lions do an **incredible job at reaching out to senior citizens**. They do this by holding their **annual Afternoon Tea events** which brings so many people together.

This year, around **150 guests** attended two separate events. **97** of these were brought together at **Stamford Bridge Village Hall** whilst a further **50 went to the second event in Wheldrake**. Attendees, including those from local care homes, enjoyed **turkey butties** complete with Stuffing and Cranbury sauce, **followed by trifle together with tea or coffee**. A popular addition for many being a drink from the bar.

Guests were then entertained with a **free raffle** with many guests donating raffle prizes and **Christmas songs from a Ukulele Band and a local ladies choir**. All this could not have been achieved without **food provided by a local Restaurateur and many volunteers whom the Club thanks profusely**.



Filey Lions

Filey Lions have also been hosting a massive get-together for their elderly residents with their well received, **Over 85's Christmas lunch at Cayton Bay Holiday Park**. During the day, **74 guests** joined them for a **lip smacking 3-course lunch**, live entertainment and, of course, a **visit and gift from the man in red himself**, who had **brought his wife and his elves** along to give him a hand. The guests had a truly fantastic day including (as pictured) **Clauses who was their oldest guest at 102**. A further, festive treat saw the Lions take a **coach trip (of 50 guests and volunteers)** to a **carol concert held by Bridlington Lions** on top of a number of supermarket collections and other projects by the Lions.



Doncaster Lions



Doncaster Lions have been helping vulnerable people as well this festive period.

Working in close partnership with **Well Doncaster, Fish Bits and Action for the Needy and Homeless**, they were able to provide food to some of the neediest people in their town. All together, the Club gave out **60 portions of fish chips, a sausage and a soft drink** in a big joint project. **A tasty and satisfying way to make a positive difference.**

Wetherby District Lions

In Wetherby, the Lions have announced their '**Townsperson of the year**' who, for 2026 will be **Louise (Loo) Pedley** who has been celebrated for her voluntary work in the town. The Lions, who host the award, were delighted to present her with a **trophy and have her name engraved on the roll in the Town Hall**. Another local hero celebrated by the Club is **Adele Fairburn from the Bee-Crafty Markets** who was given a **Certificate of Appreciation** for her continued help in organising the indoor markets at the **Club's Dickensian Market**.
