
1st Vice Governor's Message

Dumfries Lions




The Russian war of aggression against Ukraine has touched many of us and had global ramifications. As Lions, we have done some fab work to help the people of Ukraine such as by sending stoves and backing other projects.

In Dumfries, the Lions have been doing their bit via a donation of £500 to the local Ambulances for Ukraine organisation who have already made 9 journeys to the war-torn country loaded with necessary supplies including toys, clothes and medical assistance.

Also backing global efforts have been **Dumfries Lions Stuart Armstrong and Jock Carlyle** who recently completed a **500 mile round trip from Dumfries to Lions HQ with approximately 20,000 pairs of spectacles** from contacts in Scotland as part of our Lionistic project. Included within this were **3,000 pairs** from the Dumfries area project which is co-ordinated by Lion Wendy Tremble.

In true keeping with the District's Mental Health and Well-Being push, Darlington Lions has donated £5,000 to The Listening Post, a local charity which supports the mental health and well-being of young people. This is the second donation of £5,000 to The Listening Post in the past 12 months.

The Listening Post is a free and confidential listening and mentoring service which helps more than 270 students a year at schools and
