Tales from our Clubs

Boroughbridge Lions



Whilst many of our Clubs reported on their Festive Service last issue, there are still a few of these **amazing Christmas acts to be shared!**

In Boroughbridge, their '**Santa & his Sleigh**' program was completed on schedule with house to house collections being carried out in **Boroughbridge and 10 local villages** alongside **static collections at local supermarkets**. Added to this, the Club also arranged a **Tombola at Boroughbridge Late Night Shopping evening**.

All went really well but 3 evenings were unfortunately postponed due to wet weather. Furthermore, the Club also did have to recruit stand-in Santas due to illness. However, despite this, the Lions are pleased to report that **everyone was very generous and the events were successful**. The Club now has **significant funds to support local needy causes**.

Holme Valley Lions

Holme Valley Lions were very busy over Christmas as they took part in a number of **static sleighs at key locations**. Over the Christmas period, they did 2 stints at 3 locations and raised an **approx. £2500** which the Club was very happy with. Even though the Club was saddened that they weren't able to do their normal sleigh routes/routine, **they are proud of the total received** which will be bolstered by Gift Aid.



Further to this, the Lions were able to apply for a grant once again for monies to **help 3 local foodbanks as well as for girls' hygiene poverty packs, vouchers and sanitary products**. All the recipients were extremely happy with the donations and this led to some positive reviews on Facebook. The **Lions encourage other Clubs to apply for such grants** to support their community and make that real difference to vulnerable people who we serve.

Knaresborough Lions



Continuing the Christmas theme, **Knaresborough Lions** have been reflecting on their **annual Christmas Party for elderly folk** in the town which was held in mid-December.

For the event, Lions transported people to and from the venue, managed the afternoon and arranged both the catering and entertainment. The latter of which was provided by the **Knaresborough**

Choral Society and accordionist Bobby Grieve.

As you can imagine, the **Lions absolutely love putting on this fantastic event** especially as it is fast becoming a **collaborative venture with other community groups, which the Club welcomes**.



Like most Lions Clubs, December for Thorne Rural Lions means **Santa's Sleigh, Christmas events and Good Cheer**. It also, rather importantly, means raising a lot of opportunities to raise money for good causes. This year was no exception for the Lions. Overall, their **Sleigh activity raised over £11k** which the Club will look to distribute over 2026 to local causes. Their **Toy Appeal was also a big success** and exceeded their expectations as well as the outcomes from previous years.



Putting their best charitable paw forward, the local Lions have been able to **fund play equipment for the local respite children's home - Oaklands**. Despite it being cold and wet, it is being utilised daily by the children (and staff apparently). Meanwhile, the Club's first event of the year was **Burns Night**, held in conjunction with the neighbouring Lion Clubs at Wheatley Golf Club. **It was a good start for 2026 with plenty of food, drink and dancing.**

Keighley Lions



In the first week or so of January, Lions across the world were marking **'Hunger' week**. During these special 7 days, Clubs focused their efforts on highlighting the **plight of hunger in our society** and doing what they could to make a local impact.

In Keighley, the Club made a big push on encouraging their community to **reduce food waste**. Via social media, they posted a series of top tips and also some tasty recipes to help people utilise food which might otherwise have been chucked away. Further to this, they were proud to promote their local Salvation Army who host a **'Victory Programme'** which advises people on how to cook on a budget.

The largest piece of service for the Club though was a super afternoon at their local, All Nation's Church. Working closely with the Church, the Lions put on a **Mad Hatter's Tea Party** where some specially Invited (and vulnerable) guests were given some free food and refreshments. Music was provided by a local artist called **Songbirde (Anna Mitchell)** who performed beautifully and added so much to the afternoon. Meanwhile, a very enjoyable game of Bingo was played which was run by **Lions Julie and Edward Walters**.

The Club thanks the Church who funded the afternoon as well as all their Lions: **Ruth Payne, Robert Payne, Hazel Jiggins, (myself), the Bingo duo and Sue Peel (a Friend of Lions)** who helped to provide the catering. **A perfect way to end Hunger week!**
